



Master Gunnery Sergeant Christopher Stowe is an Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) Technician that has served most recently as Marine Special Operations Command Regimental EOD and Special Activities Chief. Prior to his assignment to MARSOC, MGySgt Stowe served as Regimental EOD Chief for 6th and 8th Marines in Afghanistan in 2011 and Special Staff EOD Officer for 24th MEU Command Element in 2009. His deployment history also includes serving as Direct Action (DA) Platoon EOD Team Leader for 2D Force Reconnaissance Battalion in 2006, deploying as 2D MLG EOD Chief in Al Hit Iraq in 2006 as well as EOD Team Leader on 26th MEU in 2004, and finally as Special Staff EOD Officer for Combined Joint Task Force 7 (CJTF-7) in Baghdad, Iraq for the Mine and Explosive Ordnance Information Coordination Center in 2003. Additionally, MGySgt Stowe served as the SNCOIC and lead instructor at Dynamic Entry School, Quantico VA from 2006-2009. The first human study on cumulative blast overpressure was conducted during this time on DoD personnel at Dynamic Entry School in concert with DARPA and ARA, creating a model for comprehensive blast overpressure care within the DoD. Other duty stations include: MCAS Iwakuni, MWSS-272, and 8th Engineer Support Battalion EOD Company as an EOD Technician.
