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JAGMAN CHANGE 3 CHAPTER 9, AUTHORITY TO PERFORM NOTARIAL ACTS

<u>Purpose</u>. This Practice Advisory explains Change 3 of JAGINST 5800.7F (JAGMAN), as it effects who may perform notarial services in the Marine Corps.

Background.

- 1. Chapter 9 of the JAGMAN implements 10 U.S.C. § 1044a, Authority to Act as a Notary. On 30 March 2020, Change 3 was published. It added persons to the list of those eligible to notarize in the Department of the Navy and, as discussed below, persons notarizing for the Marine Corps.
- 2. 10 U.S.C. § 1044a grants general powers of a notary public and of a consul of the United States to the individuals below:
 - a. All judge advocates, including reserve judge advocates when not in a duty status,
 - b. All civilian legal assistance attorneys,
 - c. All civilian paralegals serving at military legal assistance offices, supervised by a military legal assistance counsel,
 - d. All adjutants, assistant adjutants, and personnel adjutants, including reserve members when not in a duty status,
 - e. For the performance of notarial acts at locations outside the U.S., all employees of a military Department or the Coast Guard who are designated by regulations of the Secretary concerned or by statute to have those powers for exercise outside the U.S., and
 - f. All other members of the armed forces, including reserve members when not in a duty status, designated by regulations of the armed forces or by statute to have those powers.

Discussion.

- 1. In addition to the list in 10 U.S.C. § 1044a, JAGMAN, Chapter 9, added the following persons to those authorized to perform notarial acts. Change 3 increased the categories of authorized persons as shown below.
 - a. All civilian attorneys serving as legal assistance attorneys and all civilian legal assistance attorney volunteers¹ when authorized by the SJA to CMC for the Marine Corps (*JAGMAN*, *Change 3*),
 - b. All officers in the grade of 0-4 and above,
 - c. All COs, XOs and commissioned admin officers,
 - d. All commissioned legal officers and commissioned or enlisted assistant legal officers,
 - e. All Marine Corps officers with an MOS of 4430 while assigned as legal administrative officers,

- f. All civilian paralegals² serving at military legal assistance offices, supervised by a military or civilian legal assistance counsel (*JAGMAN*, *Change 3*),
- g. All (Navy) legalmen,
- h. All Marine Corps legal services specialists while serving in legal billets under the direct supervision of a judge advocate or a civilian legal assistance attorney when authorized by the SJA to CMC³ (*JAGMAN*, *Change 3*), and
- i. For performance of notarial acts outside the U.S., all DON civilians supporting legal assistance offices.
- 2. Change 3 also directs persons who will provide notarizations for the Marine Corps under authority of 10 U.S.C. § 1044a and the JAGMAN to take notary training as directed by the SJA to CMC. MARADMIN 546/18 directs that training, which can be found on the SJA to CMC website: https://www.hqmc.marines.mil/sja/. Training slides are being updated to reflect Change 3. Persons otherwise authorized but who do not perform notarial acts are exempt from the training.
- 3. State notaries act pursuant to state law requirements.
