TO DEFENSE LANGUAGE INSTITUTE, MONTEREY, CA

- 1. <u>Purpose</u>. To propose TAD to Monterey, California for Japanese language sustainment training.
- 2. <u>Objective</u>. The primary objective of this trip is to improve Japanese language proficiency.
- 3. <u>Training concept</u>. Language training will be conducted through intensive classes, directed self-study, and daily one-on-one instructor sessions with the Defense Language Institute.
- 4. Itinerary. The following itinerary is proposed:

5. <u>Funding</u>. Commercial airline tickets, per diem, and language training tuition will be paid using funds obtained from the Defense Language and National Security Education Office (DLNSEO) for Foreign Area Officer (FAO) language sustainment. There will be no charge for lodging, nor reimburseable costs to DLI for the training.
