### DoD Response to COVID-19 - DoD ID Cards and Benefits

The Department of Defense (DoD) is committed to protecting the security of our nation and its people by issuing identification (ID) cards to individuals requiring access to government systems and facilities, and to eligible individuals authorized to receive Uniformed Service benefits and privileges by law.

The DoD is equally committed to the safety of it's personnel and beneficiaries, including retirees and other high-risk populations. This includes ensuring continued access to healthcare and other benefits during this time of increasing precaution and restrictions in response to the Coronavirus (COVID-19). To ensure DoD ID card offices are postured to maintain continuity of operations, and to minimize the number of non-essential required visits at DoD ID card offices, the following guidance is in effect through June 30, 2021 for USID cards ONLY:

### <u>Uniformed Services ID Cards (USID)</u>

- If a cardholder's affiliation is unchanged, USID cards which expired on or after January 1, 2020, are authorized for continued benefit use through June 30, 2021.
- Termination of cardholder affiliation with the DoD or termination of benefit eligibility shall be verified electronically prior to confiscating an expired USID card with an expiration date on or after January 1, 2020.
- Remote USID card renewals and reissuance shall be expanded.
- Remote family member enrollment/eligibility updates are authorized.
- Remote USID card initial issuance for first-time issuance or replacement of lost/stolen ID card is authorized.
- All remotely-issued USID cards shall be issued with an expiration date not to exceed one year from the date of issuance.
- The minimum age for initial USID card issuance is increased from 10 to 14 years.
- Continued use of the Reserve USID card to obtain active duty benefits is authorized for mobilized Reservists and their eligible dependents.

The Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS) will continue to be the authoritative source to verify statutory eligibility for DoD Healthcare and other benefits.

### ID Card Office Online (IDCO)

The IDCO web application is used to update information stored on a user's CAC, and to add and update family member information. The website also allows individuals to locate their nearest ID card facility and schedule appointments. DoD ID card facilities are keeping their hours and availability, phone lines, and websites up to date on the site locator and appointment scheduler found at:

The Armed Services Blood Program (ASBP) - also known as the Military Blood Program - is the official military provider of blood products to U.S. armed forces.

As a joint operation among the military services (Army, Navy, Air Force), the ASBP:

- Provides quality blood products for service members, veterans and their families in both peace and war.
- Collects, processes, stores, distributes, and transfuses blood worldwide.
- Works closely with civilian counterparts in times of need.

Since March, over 5.3 million Americans have tested positive for COVID-19. To date, there has been no definitive treatment or vaccine; however, the Food and Drug Administration has authorized the use of COVID-19 Convalescent Plasma (CCP) as an investigational treatment for patients with COVID-19 infections.

To assist in the national response to COVID-19, the Military Health System is collecting blood and/or plasma from beneficiaries who have recovered from the illness. The ASBP encourages you to donate blood or plasma at your local Blood Donor Center (BDC) to help members of our military family who are, or who may, become seriously ill with COVID-19.

### **COVID-19 Convalescent Plasma**

### What is Convalescent Plasma (CCP)?

When a person contracts a virus, in this case, SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes the disease COVID-19, their immune system creates antibodies to fight the virus. These antibodies are found in the person's plasma, the liquid part of blood. Plasma with these infection-fighting antibodies is called "convalescent plasma." Through the blood donation process, this plasma is collected from a recovered person and transfused into a sick patient who is still fighting the virus. CCP may boost the immune system of the patient and help with the recovery process.

While it is not known for certain that the treatment will be effective, there is anecdotal evidence that suggests it might. The therapy has been approved by the Federal Drug Administration as an emergency use investigational new drug (eIND) protocol as an option to treat patients suffering from COVID-19.

### **Eligibility Requirements**

- 1. Previously tested positive for COVID-19
- 2. At least 17 years of age
- 3. Weigh at least 110 pounds
- 4. You are in good health and have been symptom-free for at least 28 days.

Along with this, if you have ever been pregnant, additional testing may be needed to determine if you have developed HLA antibodies since your last pregnancy.

If you meet these criteria, contact your local Blood Donation Center (BDC) using the information found on pages 4 - 7, and schedule an appointment to donate. If you have any questions, please contact the BDC or your Patient Centered Medical Home/Medical Home Port team.

The COVID-19 Convalescent Plasma Collection Program (CCP) is a Department of Defense effort to collect 10,000 units of convalescent plasma donated by members of the military community who have recovered from the disease. Convalescent plasma will be used to treat critically ill patients and to support the development of an effective treatment against the disease. Eligible donors should contact the Armed Services Blood Program at <a href="https://www.militaryblood.dod.mil/Donors/COVID-19andBloodDonation.aspx">https://www.militaryblood.dod.mil/Donors/COVID-19andBloodDonation.aspx</a> to find a complete list of available collection centers.

Marines assigned to Marine Corps Recruit Depot San Diego in California who have tested positive for COVID-19 donated plasma at Naval Medical Center San Diego.

In support of the development of an effective treatment, The Defense Department launched a campaign in late May to collect 10,000 units of plasma from patients who have recovered from COVID-19.

"The hope is that these Marines who have tested positive and recovered from COVID-19 will have developed antibodies," said Ellyn Alcantara, a clinical nurse assigned to the medical center's blood donor center. "These antibodies could lead to developments in a treatment for COVID-19."

All of the Marines volunteered to donate their plasma with the hope that their antibodies will help others. "It makes me feel good to be a part of the solution to this pandemic," said Marine Corps Pfc. Xavier Flores, a recent donor.

Upon arriving at the donor center, the Marines were given a medical health screening to determine their donor eligibility.

Once they are cleared to donate plasma, a complete blood count and hematocrit test ensures the proportion of red blood cells in the body is optimal for donation and would have no adverse effects on the donor.

"A transfusion transmissible infection test will be performed on all donors as a part of their screening process," said Navy Lt. Therica Reynolds, the officer in charge of the medical center's Blood Donor Center. "We're trying to maximize our plasma collection and do our part for patient care."

Reynolds said apheresis — the plasma donation process — takes about an hour from the beginning of the screening process to the end of the collection. Convalescent COVID-19 plasma, or CCP, from recovered COVID-19-positive patients has been used at the medical center to help symptomatic patients recover.

"A qualified donor is eligible to donate every 28 days, and one person can potentially donate four doses, or bags, of CCP per visit," Reynolds said. "We highly encourage potential donors to make an appointment for one of our five apheresis machines. Anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19 and has recovered is encouraged to come into our [donation center] and get screened to donate."

### Federal Employees Dental and Vision Program 2021 Plan Improvements

**WASHINGTON, D.C.** – The U.S. Office of Personnel Management (OPM) has selected insurance carriers to provide comprehensive, accessible and competitively priced dental and vision coverage through the Federal Employees Dental and Vision Program (FEDVIP), effective January 1, 2021. The contract term is seven (7) years.

The competitive application process allowed OPM to strengthen the FEDVIP program through increased focus on wellness and education. OPM improved quality assurance, financial reporting processes, and enhanced fraud waste and abuse (FWA) requirements. In the 2021 plan year, the number of FEDVIP dental carriers will increase from 10 to 12. The number of vision carriers will increase from 4 to 5. OPM anticipates no disruption of enrollee's continuity of services.

Eligible individuals may enroll, cancel, or change their enrollment during the Federal Benefits Open Season this year, November 9 to December 14, 2020.

FEDVIP has 3.3 million unique enrollees. This includes 1.7 million enrollees enrolled in both programs. In total, the program provides dental and vision benefits to a total of 6.9 million Federal employees, uniformed service members, retirees and their family members. It provides comprehensive dental and vision insurance at competitive group rates with leading dental and vision carriers. FEDVIP enrollees give the program high marks for quality and value.

# CHANGES Coming Soon For Some TRICARE Select Beneficiaries

Starting on Jan. 1, 2021, **TRICARE Select Group A** retired beneficiaries must pay monthly enrollment fees in order to maintain their TRICARE health coverage. This is a change, and the first time this beneficiary group will pay enrollment fees.

"In 2021, some TRICARE beneficiaries will pay enrollment fees for the first time, a change mandated by Congress," said Dr. Danita Hunter, director of the TRICARE Health Plan at the Defense Health Agency. "We're communicating this well before the change is implemented so beneficiaries can be informed about the change, as well as their TRICARE plan and cost options."



### Here are the key points you need to know.



### What's happening?

Retired TRICARE Select beneficiaries will have to pay enrollment fees. This change was mandated by Congress in the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year October 1 - September 30 2017. Congress granted the Defense Health Agency a delay in implementation to calendar year 2021.

### Who's impacted?

This change only affects **Group A** retirees and their families enrolled in TRICARE select. You're in **Group A** if your initial enlistment or appointment or that of your uniformed services sponsor began before Jan. 1, 2018. Active duty family members enrolled in TRICARE Select will experience no change, and won't pay enrollment fees.

### This applies to me. When do I need to take action?

You must set up a monthly allotment through your Department of Defense (DoD) pay center, where feasible, for your monthly payments to start on January 1, 2021. For sponsors who don't receive funds through a DoD pay center, you can establish payments via electronic funds transfer, credit card, or debit card. Your regional contractor will soon issue instructions to set up payment.

### What are the 2021 enrollment fees for TRICARE Select Group A retirees?

The enrollment fees will be collected via monthly installments from the sponsor's military pay system where retired pay is disbursed.

- Individual plan: \$12.50 per month
- Family plan: \$25.00 per month

### How can I stay informed and prepare for this change?

TRICARE will inform you of specific actions you need to take in the coming months. Take command of your health and your health care benefits in 2020.

### **Armed Forces Retirement Home Accepting Applications for Residency!**

The Armed Forces Retirement Home (AFRH), with locations in Washington, D.C., and Gulfport, MS, continues to welcome new residents. These healthy, vibrant and soughtafter retirement communities for eligible veterans offer affordable independent living opportunities at rates that will remain unchanged through 2021.

Maintaining the health of the residents and staff during COVID-19 remains their highest priority. Thanks to multiple protections in place – including continuous COVID-19 surveillance testing, social distancing, the wearing of masks and use of hand sanitizers—the Home has experienced very few cases among residents during this extraordinary time.

To qualify to live at an AFRH, veterans are eligible from one of three main categories:

Category 1: 60 years of age or older and served at least 20 years on active duty, with the majority of that time spent in the enlisted ranks or as a warrant officer. Eighty five percent of our residents spent a career in the military.

Veterans who spent the majority of their service time in the enlisted ranks, but did not serve at least 20 years on active duty may be eligible.

- Category 2: Veterans who have at least a 50% service-connected disability, or
- Category 3: Veterans who served in a war theater (such as in Vietnam, Kuwait, Iraq and Afghanistan) and now have an injury, disease or disability.

Rooms are currently available at both locations with no waiting period, down payment or contract required! For eligible veterans moving into an AFRH in 2020 and 2021, the rate for independent living is 46.7% of the resident's gross monthly income or \$2,050.00, whichever is less.

All applicants must be able to live independently upon moving to the AFRH. The Home also provides advanced levels of care to our residents after they have been accepted into independent living. These include assisted living, long-term care, and memory support.

In Washington, D.C., AFRH offers residents a scenic, wooded campus just minutes from downtown - home to museums, monuments, and a host of local entertainment, sports and other cultural options. In Gulfport, MS, AFRH offers residents a beautiful view of the Gulf of Mexico, with an outdoor swimming pool, walking path to the beach, reflecting pool, art studio and modern media room.

Superior medical, dental and vision care are offered, with amenities that include: private rooms with a shower, three delicious daily meals prepared by licensed nutritionists in a modern dining facility, a wellness program and deluxe fitness center, movie theater, bowling center, numerous hobby shops, clubs, and social activities.

Services include recreational activities and resident day trips, a full-service library, barber shop, beauty salon, 24/7 security, computer center, mailboxes, ATM, campus PX/NEX and convenient transportation available to local hospitals and appointments. Residents also have access to additional services such as on-site physical and occupational therapy, in-room internet and cable TV, podiatry, and counseling.

Married couples are welcome to apply for residency at AFRH and discounts are available:

- If both individuals meet all military and other eligibility requirements in their own right, or
- If the eligible veteran completed at least 20 years of active service and married current spouse prior to military retirement.

Veterans who have been convicted of a felony or are not free of drug, alcohol, or psychiatric problems are ineligible to become a resident. ### **Cancer Screening During the COVID-19 Pandemic**

At the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, elective medical procedures, including cancer screening, were largely put on hold to prioritize urgent needs and reduce the risk of the spread of COVID-19 in healthcare settings. One consequence of this has been a substantial decline in cancer screening.

As states and other authorities re-open businesses and ease restrictions, many healthcare facilities are starting to offer elective procedures again, including cancer screening. Restarting cancer screening requires careful consideration of the risks and benefits of screening, along with ensuring safety for both patients and healthcare personnel. Decisions about restarting screening depend on many factors, and they may not be the same for every person. They will likely vary by community while the pandemic continues.

### Regular cancer screening is still important

If you had an appointment for screening that was postponed or canceled, talk to your healthcare team about when to reschedule. Your provider can discuss balancing the risks and benefits of being screened now or postponing for a later date, taking into account your personal and family history, other risk factors, and the timing of your last screening test.

It is also important to keep in mind that the focus here is on cancer *screening*. Screening tests look for cancer in people who don't have symptoms. These tests are different from tests your doctor might order if you have symptoms that could be from cancer. If you have signs or symptoms that might be from cancer, for instance, a lump in the breast or blood in the stool, you should discuss this with your provider right away, as you will need exams or tests that evaluate those particular signs and symptoms.

Your health care provider can help you determine what screening schedule and which screening tests are best for you at this time.



### Five Ways to Help Reduce Your Breast Cancer Risk

- 1. Get to and stay at a healthy weight.
- 2. Be physically active and avoid time spent sitting.
- 3. Follow a healthy eating pattern.
- 4. It is best not to drink alcohol.
- 5. Think carefully about using hormone replacement therapy (HRT)

To help you plan for 2020, below is a list of the days you should expect to receive your retired or annuitant pay. Retired and annuitant pay is due on the first of the month. However, if the first falls on a weekend or holiday, retirees get paid on the last business day of the prior month and annuitants get paid on the first business day of month. For example, payment to retirees for December 2019 were paid on December 31, 2019.

# MARINE CORPS JUNIOR RESERVE OFFICER TRAINING CORPS LEADERDHIP FOR THE FUTURE

Since its inception in 1916, the Junior Reserve Officers' Training Corps (JROTC) program has been viewed as a strong program that provides youth with much-needed skills in citizenship and leadership.

The Marine Corps Junior Reserve Officers' Training Corps (MCJROTC) is looking for a few good men and women to serve as instructors at various high schools throughout the United States and overseas. Marines selected to serve in these positions teach MCJROTC cadets discipline, self-confidence, and leadership skills required to prepare them to meet future challenges.

Marines approved to be MCJROTC instructors upon hiring, receive a stipend from the Marine Corps and the respective school system that as a minimum, when added to retirement pay, will equal full military pay and allowances.

The Commanding General, Training and Education Command, Quantico, VA, certifies MCJROTC instructor applicants. Marines may apply for approval as a MCJROTC instructor within one year of the effective date of retirement. Marines interested in serving as MCJROTC instructors can download an instructor application at <a href="https://www.mcjrotc.marines.mil/Applications/">https://www.mcjrotc.marines.mil/Applications/</a>.

MCJROTC Instructor Qualifications

### **Senior Marine Instructor (SMI)**

- 1. Officer or Warrant Officer with at least 20 years active duty, or Temporary Early Retirement Authority (TERA) program with 15 or more years active duty, who are eligible to receive retirement pay.
- 2. Confirmed retirement date from Manpower Management Separation and Retirement Branch.
- 3. Retiring or transferring to the Fleet Marine Corps Reserve (FMCR) as an Officer with at least 20 years active service and eligible for retirement pay.
- 4. Bachelor's Degree.
- 5. Competitive military record.
- 6. Physically qualified according to MCJROTC standards.

### **Marine Instructor (MI)**

- 1. Warrant Officer (without a college Degree) or SNCO with at least 20 years active duty, or Temporary Early Retirement Authority (TERA) program with 15 or more years of active duty and eligible to receive retirement pay.
- 2. Confirmed retirement date from Manpower Management Separation and Retirement Branch.
- 3. Retiring or transferring to the Fleet Marine Corps Reserve (FMCR) as a SNCO with at least 20 years active service and eligible for either retirement pay or retainer pay upon EAS.
- 4. High school graduate. Complete an Associate's Degree within 5 years of hire.
- 5. Competitive military record.

# Steps to Take When an Annuitant Dies

### ELIGIBILITY FOR SURVIVOR BENEFIT PLAN ANNUITY PAY ENDS WITH THE DEATH OF THE ANNUITANT (BENEFICIARY)

Prompt reporting of a deceased military annuitant's death can help avoid delay and prevent possible financial hardship for the surviving family members or executors, who will be required to return any unearned payments of the decedent's annuity pay if payment is erroneously received. \*\*\*While the VA does not provide burial benefits for annuitants, the annuitant may be eligible for burial in a military cemetery.

Follow these steps to report the death of an annuitant:

- 1. Call DFAS at 1-800-321-1080 to report the death and stop annuity pay.
- 2. Mail or fax a copy of the annuitant's death certificate to:


- 3. Inform any financial institutions receiving payments about the death of the annuitant. (Provide a copy of the death certificate when it becomes available).
- 4. If applicable, contact the following agencies/departments immediately to report the death:
- Social Security Administration: 1-800-772-1213 www.ssa.gov
- **Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System:** 1-800-538-9552

If you believe you are the victim of an error or injustice which affects your military record, you may apply for a Correction of Military Records by completing and submitting a DD Form 149, Application for Correction of Military Record. Examples of corrections include: upgraded discharge, promotions, retired pay, household goods, pay date change, bonus, and MGIB programs. DFAS pays military members when the Board for Corrections of Naval Records (BCNR) rule in their favor. If you received a decision from the BCNR and you do not agree with it, write the Board and explain your reasoning. Reference the appropriate address on page 2 of the DD Form 149. If you would like to check the status of your request contact the BCNR directly at (703) 604 - 6884 (Navy/Marine Corps). If you believe DFAS paid you incorrectly for your Correction of Record, provide documentation with a handwritten signature explaining why you are protesting the amount to:

### Steps to Take When a Retired Marine Dies

1. REPORT THE DEATH TO DFAS at 1-888-332-7411 to stop retirement pay and avoid indebtedness. If the retired Marine was receiving pay from another source due to a disability from the VA or civil service retirement from the Office of Personnel Management, contact that agency to return the payment. If you fail to do this, you will have to repay it later.

For families located overseas, the commercial number is **216-522-5955**, select option 3 to be directed to the appropriate representative.

NOTE: DFAS will forward a confirmed death listing to Headquarters, U.S. Marine Corps (MMSR-6) for inclusion in an upcoming issue of this newsletter under the Taps column.

- 2. Within 7-10 business days after reporting the death to DFAS, you should receive a letter containing the following documents:
  - a. SF1174 Claim for Unpaid Compensation of Deceased Member of the Uniformed Service
  - b. Annuity account forms and instructions (if the decedent was enrolled in the Survivor Benefit Plan or the Retired Serviceman's Family Protection Plan)
  - c. W-4P Withholding Certificate for Pension or Annuity Payments
  - d. Direct Deposit form

Complete the forms you received with your letter and return them with a copy of the retiree's death certificate that includes cause of death to:

- 3. REPORT SURVIVOR BENEFIT PLAN ELECTION, *if applicable*. Designated annuitants will receive notification from DFAS if the deceased retired Marine elected SBP. If you are uncertain whether an election was made, call DFAS at 1-800-321-1080.
- 4. UPDATE YOUR MILITARY ID CARD. Your status has changed, and as the survivor of a deceased Marine, your ID card must be updated to reflect it due to the Marine's death. Access your nearest ID site at <a href="https://idco.dmdc.osd.mil/idco">https://idco.dmdc.osd.mil/idco</a> or call HQMC (MMSR-6) at 1-800-336-4649 or (703) 784-9310 to obtain the sites closest to you.
- 5. NOTIFY THE SOCIAL SECURITY ADMINISTRATION at 1-800-SSA-1213 (www.ssa.gov) to apply for the \$255 death benefit, *if applicable*.
- 6. CONTACT THE VA at 1-800-827-1000 FOR BURIAL AND OTHER VA BENEFITS, such as VA disability payments. Acopy of the sponsor's DD 214 is required. Visit <a href="www.va.gov">www.va.gov</a> for more information.
- 7. CONTACT THE U.S. OFFICE OF PERSONNEL MANAGEMENT at 1-888-767-6738 if the sponsor was receiving civil service pay.

# MILITARY FUNERAL HONORS FOR BURIALS OUTSIDE ARLINGTON NATIONAL CEMETERY (ANC)

The funeral director (preferred) or a family member can contact the HQMC Military Funeral Honors Section at (866) 826-3628 or (703) 432-9524 to request Military Funeral Honors for a veteran. The funeral director (or family member) must be able to provide the Marine's complete name, SSN, rank, status (retired or veteran), date of birth, date of death, and place of death/interment. In addition, a copy of the Marine's DD-214 needs to be provided for verification of "honorable service". If a DD-214 is not readily available, it can be requested through the National Personnel Records Center in St. Louis, MO. The following link provides additional details:


- Gather important documents for claims processing (e.g., birth certificate, will, etc.)
